A BRIEF HISTORY OF COMMON LAW

When studying law in the UK you will not only be immersed in a world class academic atmosphere, but also fully immersed in the staggering legal history that you are surrounded by, allowing you to build upon your formal legal education outside of the classroom. When you visit the Tower of London's Norman Chapel of St. John, you are standing in the place where King Henry I, known as the Lion of Justice, issued the pre-cursor to the Magna Carta in 1100 called the Coronation Charter.

This legal charter addressed accountability of royal powers, simony, pluralism, and taxation abuse and can be found in the Lambeth Palace Library as well as within the pages of the 12th century legal encyclopedia manuscript the Textus Roffensis. The Textus Roffensis is part of the Rochester Cathedral Library and includes the early seventh century Law of Æthelberht of Kent, which is the oldest surviving English Law Code, the oldest Anglo-Saxon text, and perhaps the oldest law code of any Germanic language. The famed Magna Carta Libertatum or the Great Charter of Liberties was created by the Archbishop of Canterbury and celebrated its 800th birthday in 2015. The four surviving copies were brought together for the occasion in London and they remain today a symbol of justice, the rights of individuals, and the right to a fair trial across the Western world.

England's capital, London, has long been a legal hub for the UK. In London you will find the four historic Inns of Court: Lincoln's Inn, Inner Temple, Middle Temple, and Gray's Inn, where barristers traditionally stayed and received their legal education. Also, in London is the Old Bailey, the building known as the Central Criminal Court of England and Wales, where many of England's most notorious criminals since the 17th century was sentenced. As it is still an active court of law today, you can watch ongoing trials from the public galleries. Nearby are both the Palace of Westminster which held the House of Lords, the precursor to the current Supreme Court, and the Royal Courts of Justice which is one of the largest courts in Europe.

The Royal Courts of Justice holds original documentation from the famous Guy Fawkes trials from 1605 and still contains the High Court and Court of Appeal for England.

3 YEAR LLB DEGREE

- The same length as a qualifying Canadian Degree, but you can enter directly from high school.
- Two years of core law modules and one year of law electives
- Admission requires a High School Diploma and will consider applicants with any level of post-secondary studies

2 YEAR "ACCELERATED" LLB DEGREE

A shorter degree than those offered by any Canadian law school

- Two years of core law modules with limited law electives
- Admission requires a High School Diploma and a 4-year Undergraduate Degree

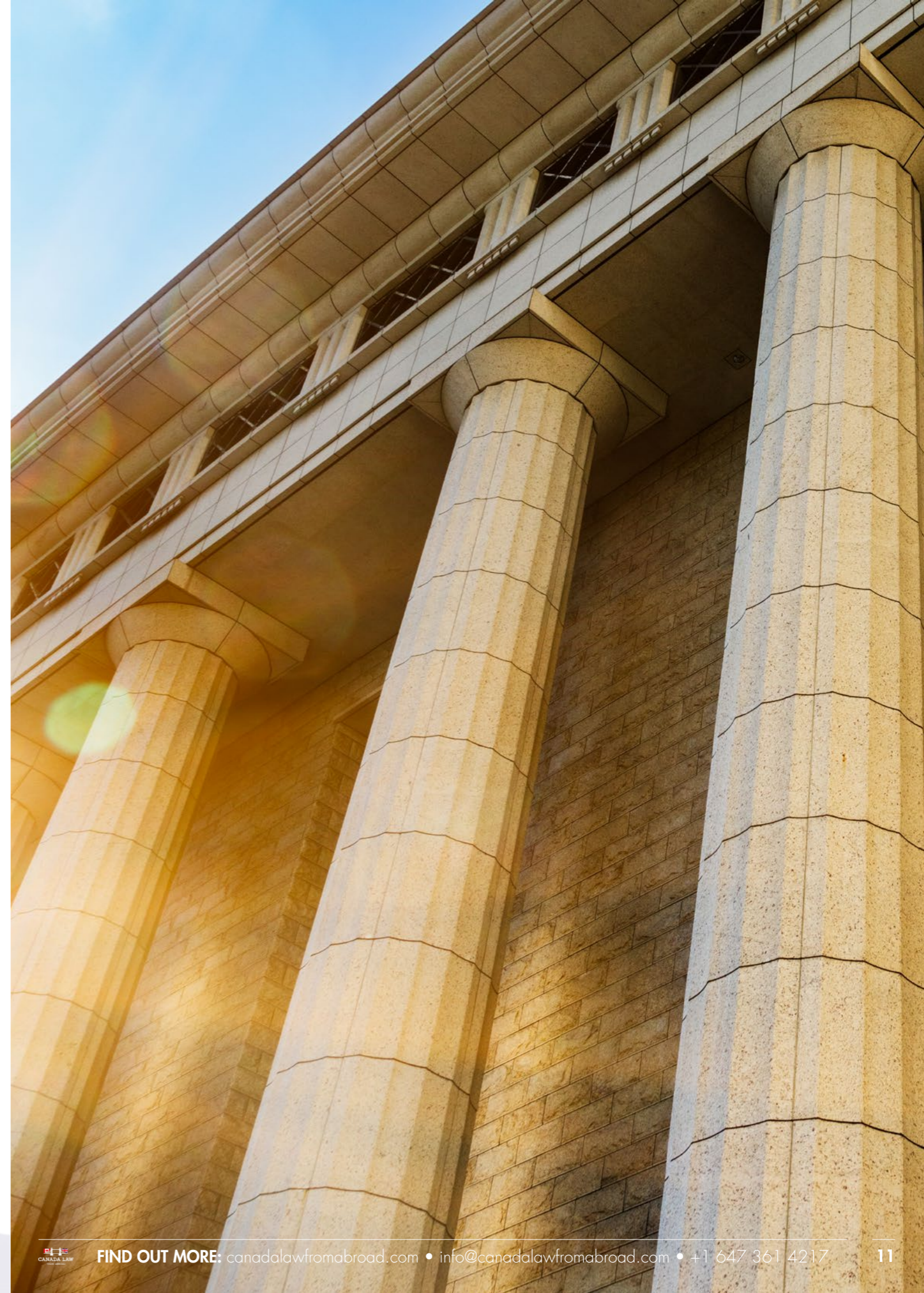
1 YEAR GRADUATE LLM (MASTERS OF LEGAL LAWS)

A specialised LLM that does not always require an LLB, unlike in Canada

- Admission requires an Undergraduate Degree, not necessarily in the study of Law
- Program is 12 months in length
- Specialism in Law creates career opportunities
- Program allow for flexibility in the focus of your research

PHD

- Minimum 3 years in length
- Choose from a vast range of research topics
- Pursue the opportunity for ground-breaking research

OTHER STUDY OPTIONS:

COMBINE A 2 YEAR LLB AND 1 YEAR LLM

Pursue a 2 year Accelerated LLB and follow up with a 1 year LLM to maximize employability. This combination will also cut the number of accreditation exams you have to complete to the minimum 5. By pursuing this route you will obtain a specialist Law degree in the same length of time it takes to complete a general JD degree in Canada.

SUBJECT SPECIFIC LLBS

Our partner universities offer a variety of LLBs that focus in a vast range of subjects, combining a qualifying law degree with modules in Business, Politics, Philosophy, and languages. Are you interested in a career in law but not necessarily as a practicing lawyer? Or are you already a practicing lawyer but would like to stand out from the masses by specialising in a specific area of law? If the answer is yes, the Master of Laws (LLM) may be for you!

The LLM is a post graduate degree which provides legal career aspirants with valuable knowledge in law. In today's changing market globalization has led to the increased diversification of professional services which has affected the legal services market, making the LLM a highly sought after degree. Individuals aware of emerging consulting opportunities in the new economy are taking the opportunity to add value to their career arsenal by obtaining a LLM as their legal services career credential.

The program focuses in a specific area such as: commercial law, international human rights, maritime law, intellectual property law, energy and oil law, and several others.

LLM GRADUATES CAN:

- Pursue further studies such as a PhD in Law order to achieve an academic career in research or university teaching.
- Work as a legal consultant or policy writer in non-governmental organizations, governmental agencies, business corporations, and consulting firms
- Help working lawyers build their legal practice as a specialist in their chosen sub-field

PRACTICE LAW IN CANADA

ACCREDITATION THROUGH THE NCA

- UK LLB and Canadian JD degrees are both qualifying law degrees with the same core Common Law curriculum
- The accreditation of 'foreign' law degrees to practice in Canada is administered by the National Committee on Accreditation
- The accreditation of a Common Law LLB degree from the UK is a routine process in Canada
- Accreditation can be achieved by writing self-study exams or completing an approved program at a Canadian Law School
- Students with three years of UK Law education (Three Year LLB or a Two Year LLB followed by a One Year LLM) usually write five NCA exams
- Two Year Accelerated LLB graduates will usually write seven NCA exams to meet the 'three years of legal education' requirement for their Canadian Certificate of Qualification.
- The Accreditation process can be completed in six to eighteen months

Birmingham is a truly global university with law students from all around the world and is one of the most popular British universities for Canadian students choosing to study law overseas. We have around 100 Canadian students currently studying law at Birmingham, and the LLB and LLB for Graduates programmes are particularly popular – the LLB for Graduates degree allowing students already holding an undergraduate degree to qualify in two years, and the three-year LLB degree allowing students to enter directly from high school. All of our LLB degrees are Qualifying Law Degrees.

Law students have the option to study a module in Canadian Constitutional Law which supports their understanding of the Canadian legal system, as well as assisting with completion of the NCAs.

As well as having one of the UK's oldest and largest student-run law societies, the Holdsworth Club, the Law School also offers the Centre for Professional Legal Education and Research (CEPLER) which radically extends the provision of extra-curricular activities to enhance students' employability and increase their experience of law in action: including pro bono, mooting and debating. Our Canadian students are very active in the various pro bono group projects that we run at Birmingham.

We work closely with a number of law firms which are well-known in Canada and we have a comprehensive Careers and Employability programme to support Canadian students, which is useful for supporting their job search in any country – from weekly careers events to an annual Law Fair with over 60 law firms in attendance, as well as a mentoring scheme, and placement opportunities. There is also an annual Canadian Careers Conference. We have many alumni who have gone on to successful legal careers in Canada.

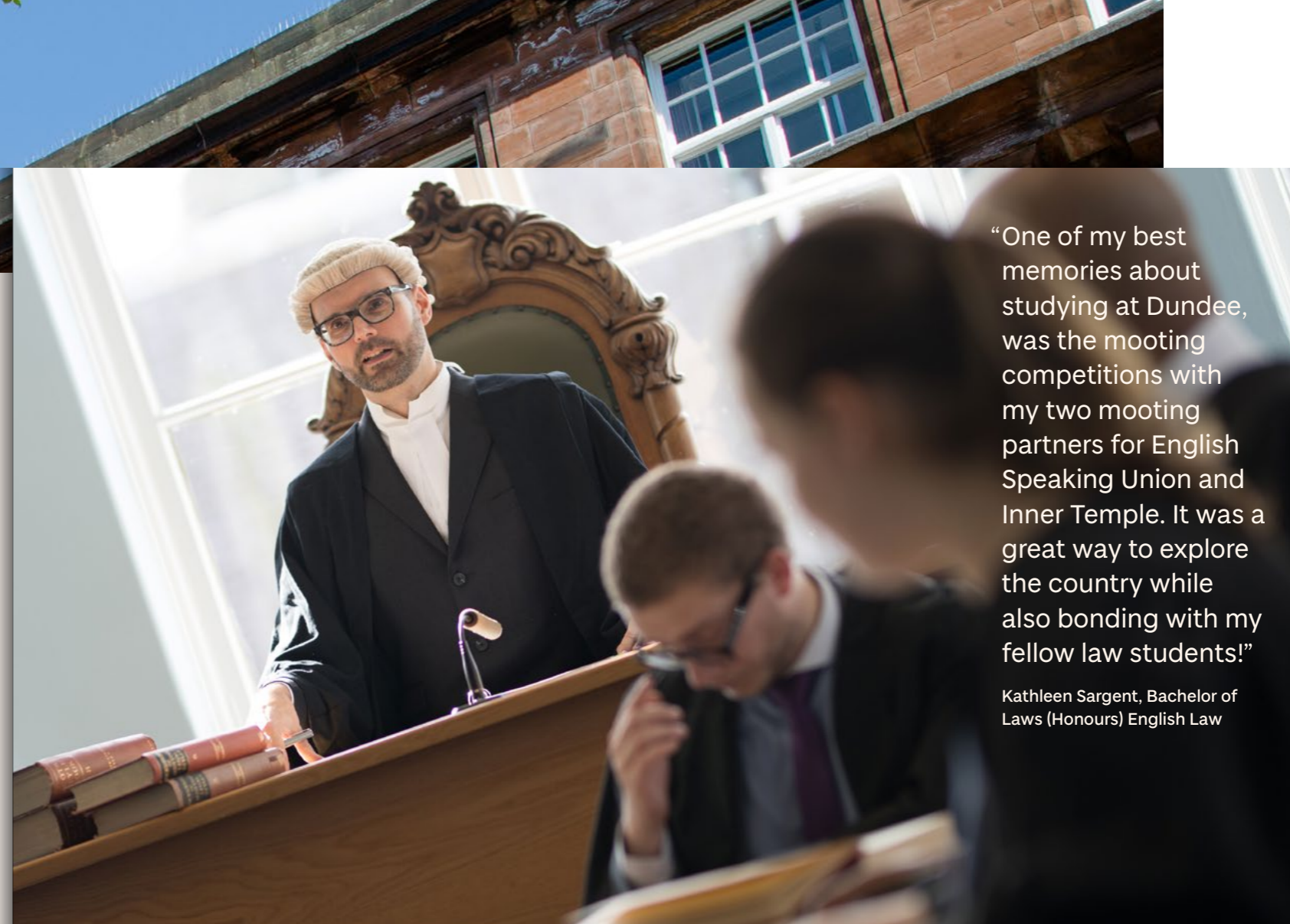

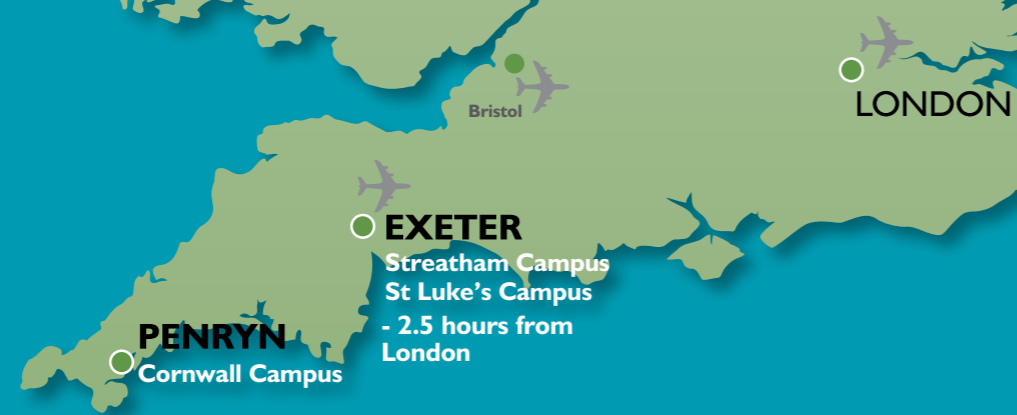

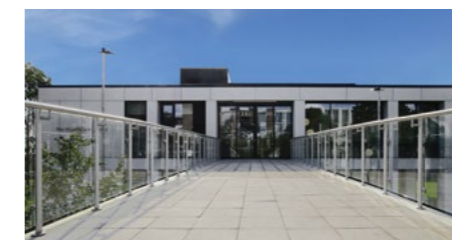

Interdisciplinarity, intellectual challenge and creative thinking have always been fundamental to a Sussex education, and this is present in all our Law degrees. Our two and three-year LLBs teach all the core module areas (including Canadian Constitutional Law) essential for a qualifying Law degree, whilst also offering a broad range of options for you to try, and to tailor your interests: Canadian administrative law, fashion, environmental, Aboriginal or even sport!

These degrees also come with the option for practical experience. Our Law Clinic hosts a series of real-world law projects which allow you to gain experience giving supervised legal advice and assistance in the community. One recent case involved our students aiding a mother who's employer had fallen foul of maternity laws.

As a Law student at Sussex you will develop legal and transferable skills through your timetabled studies but also by taking part in national and international mootings, client interviewing, criminal advocacy and negotiation competitions. Many Sussex students have achieved great success in these competitions, competing in legal competitions in India and Puerto Rico, and winning the Mayo Wynn Baxter Junior mooting competition in 2014. With many of these competitions sponsored by leading law firms including DMH Stallard, you will network with law firms and even win work experience opportunities. You will also attend workshops and training sessions run by legal experts to help you prepare for the competitions.

We have an extensive Employability programme that runs across all years

of your degree, giving you access to local and national law firms, and training on how to present yourself to future employers in both the legal and non-legal professions.

Our spacious single-site campus is located in a national park, and has kept a strong connection to the natural beauty of the surrounding environment. 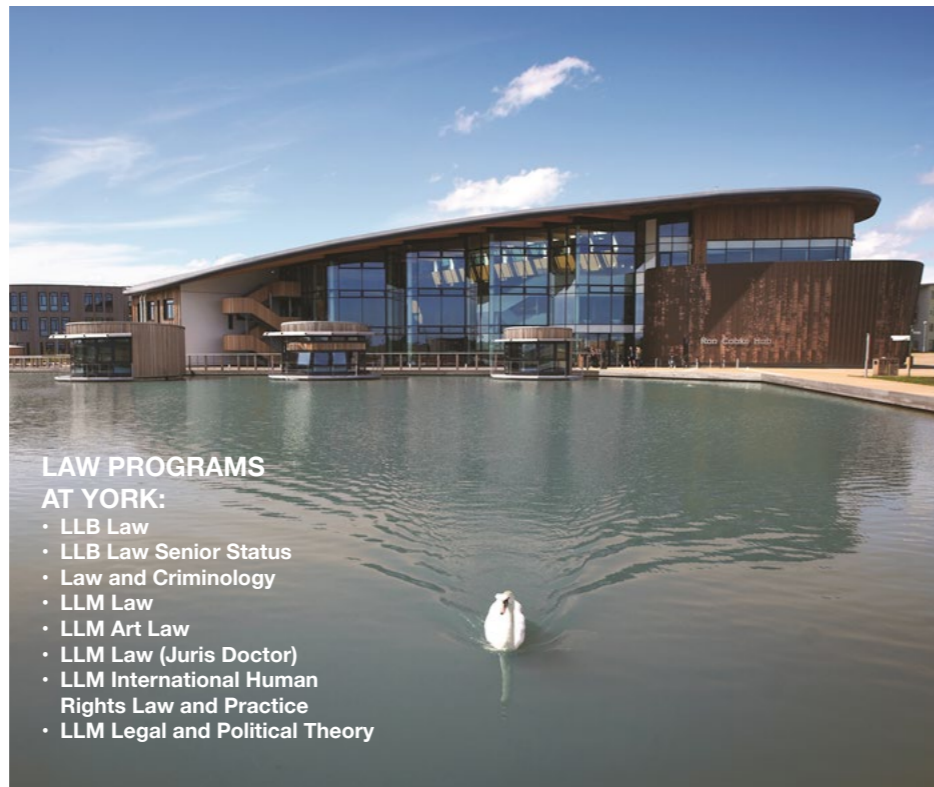
The York Law School - A unique way of learning

Student life


Your life at York is about much more than just your degree programme. The vast number of opportunities available on campus will help you make friends, develop skills and gain experiences.

RETURNING TO CANADA: ACCREDITATION AND THE NCA PROCESS

The NCA (National Committee on Accreditation) is the organization responsible for the assessment of international Law degrees in Canada.

Any Canadian who completes an LLB in the UK and wishes to write the Barrister Exam in Canada must submit their degree to the NCA for assessment. Assessment is completed on an individual basis, so be in touch with the NCA regarding your own circumstances.

In 2015, 853 students with NCA Certificates were admitted to the bar exam, an increase of 241 over the previous year intake. The number of internationally trained lawyers being admitted to the bar admissions program continues to increase annually, demonstrating the viability of a UK law degree.

This statistic demonstrates the significant number of Canadians completing their Law degrees abroad, so rest assured, this is a well-trodden path.
